




TOTAL US GIVING IN 2022:

Overall giving fell for just the third time in the last 40 years. Adjusted for inflation, total giving fell by 10.5% in 2022.


US GIVING AS A PERCENTAGE OF GDP




Giving as a percentage of GDP dropped to 1.96% in 2022 after rising to 2.25% in 2020.

SOURCES AND RECIPIENTS OF GIFTS






US GIVING BY SOURCE



Giving from individuals decreased by 6.4% in 2022, while corporate giving saw the largest increase at 3.4%.


US GIVING BY RECIPIENT








12% of giving came from online sources.


